

History & Heritage....

THE 'BOYDSVILLE TRACK'

With the recent upgrading of the path leading from the 14th tee (formerly the 9th) it is timely to reflect on its origins. At the February 1970 meeting of the management committee, captain Bob Boyd "asked for the committee's opinion on constructing a causeway from the 9th tee over the gully towards the 9th green. After discussion it was resolved that the matter lay on the table until the May meeting'

Prior to the May meeting, the following appeared in the May 1970 Newsletter.

CAUSEWAY FROM 9th TEE?

Soon the Committee will be giving consideration to the possibility of constructing an earth causeway from near the 9th tee across the deep valley immediately in front of it towards the

Its obvious advantage would be the making easier one's movement from the tee to the green. Those who would benefit most would be those who find the present setup difficult.

The disadvantages are equally obvious. The natural contours of the links (a feature of this course) would be impaired; and as a golfing hole it would lose much of its present appeal. The threat to erosion would be ever present and lastly could not the money be better spent on other more essential tasks around the course?

Though steep, the slope is very short and for the vast majority, not too difficult. Surely the course must be designed for the majority, not the few?

There is no further mention of the proposal, either at the May meeting or subsequently, but Val Crossley recalls that Bob Boyd took the matter into his own hands and just did it, to the consternation of some on the committee. There are other current members who were around at that time - it would be much appreciated if you can add to this story. Have a look next time you play the 14th – fortunately the feared

erosion has not happened but the significant change to the natural contours makes one ponder whether such a proposal would be approved by the Heritage Council today.

Junior Golf

Sunday 28th March marked the end of another successful term for the Albany Junior Golf Academy. We had record numbers this term with 18 total with most being primary school students between the ages of 5 and 12. There was some fantastic golf played on course this term and it's exciting to watch some of them progress through the levels- for example, we have two 7 year-olds in Division 3, teeing off from 100m out on each hole and regularly scoring 3's and 4's from this distance which is very impressive given their age. For term 2 we are looking to get this number over 20 students in total so we can split the class in 2 and separate the young ones from the older ones as there is a 10-year age gap between the youngest and oldest at the moment. We look forward to another successful term of Junior Golf starting on Sunday 25th April!
